Egypt

1. India relieves Egyptian vessel of threats from Somali pirates.

4. Japan banks unlikely to settle India-Iran oil payments New Delhi, Tuesday, 7 June 2011

Iran has offered India various options to end an impasse on payments, including a choice of currencies and paying on a cargo-by-cargo basis, after India's central bank scrapped a long-standing payment system in December under pressure from the United States. Japan is unlikely to allow India to use Japanese banks to provide a clearing house mechanism for India to pay for Iranian oil imports, Japan's deputy foreign minister told Reuters on Tuesday.

13. Gaddafi-controlled fund invests US\$29.6 m in ICICI Bank ADRs

Mumbai, Tuesday, 7 June 2011

ICICI Bank emerged as the only Indian company that has caught the imagination of Col Muammar Gaddafi's Libya Investment Authority (LIA). A report leaked in the NGO Global Witness showed that ICICI Bank ADRs were the only Indian investment made by LIA and constituted 0.61 per cent of the fund's "non-strategic equity assets" under management of US\$2.46 billion. The sovereign fund controlled by Gaddafi had invested US\$29.6 million in ICICI Bank ADRs which were worth US\$31.9 million as at the end of June quarter in calendar year 2010.
