1. Egypt's Morsi pitches for 'E-BRICS'

Cairo, Tuesday, 19 March 2013

Confident of navigating his country's post-revolution transition, Egypt's President Mohamed Morsi arrived in India on Monday, 18 March to anchor a special relationship and flag his country's ambition of joining the ranks of the world's "emerging countries." Morsi expressed Egypt's deep interest in joining the Brazil-Russia-India-China-South Africa (BRICS) combine and turning the grouping into E-BRICS.

7. Saudi Malayalis jittery as Nitaqat deadline ends today

Kochi, Wednesday, 27 March 2013

Tens of thousands of Malayali workers in Saudi Arabia are on edge as the deadline for the Saudization programme called *Nitaqat* (meaning neutralization) ends on Wednesday. They face the prospect of being forced to wind up and leave on their own or face deportation, should the Saudi government stick to its plan of Saudization. Nearly two million expatriate workers, the largest chunk being Indians, would have to leave Saudi Arabia as the firms, companies, and businesses they work for have failed to comply with the *Nitaqat* programme.
