2) Chinese in Iraq are in relatively safe regions: ambassador

Baghdad, Tuesday, 1 July 2014

More than 10,000 Chinese nationals are now in relatively safe regions despite clashes between the Iraqi government troops and advancing Sunni militants. Some 80 percent of the Chinese, many of whom are employees with Chinese firms operating in Iraq live in the southern provinces, 10 percent in areas around the capital Baghdad, and the remaining 10 percent in the northern Kurdish region, Ambassador Wang Yong told Xinhua during an interview.
