3. Government says supports Palestinian cause but India has relations with Israel too New Delhi, Tuesday, 22 July 2014

After five-days, the Rajya Sabha finally discussed the Gaza situation. The government said that there was "no change in India's foreign policy on Palestine." The Opposition walked out as its demand for issuing a resolution on Gaza was rejected. External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj emphasized "all governments have continued the policy that we support the Palestinian cause but we continue to have relations with Israel."
